The Salaam Bombay Cricket Academy (SBCA) has been established to seek talent in Municipal school children and to give them a lifetime opportunity to be a part of a world-class cricket experience.

The project helps recognise talent in a section of society that can do only aspire to play 'puff-buffed' cricket before this. It also gives them an opportunity to consider sport as a vocation.

This project also instills the belief that to live your dreams you have to work hard. Achievement comes from perspiration and not from substance abuse.

Children are encouraged to find role models and heroes within themselves and not merely in the stars of fashion and glamour.

The children are not only taught by their role models but will learn to lead the team, leadership of team management, concentration, creative management and teamwork that will help them through cricket but more importantly through life.

The project started in 2005 where 60 children from 3 Municipal schools were trained at Wankar Gymkhana under the able coaching of first class cricket coach, Mr. Ashok Wasekar.

In the second year 200 children from 14 schools in 2006 were a part of the cricket academy. A core team of 28 best children were selected and coached all year round. These children also participated in various matches with other gymkhana and groups. In 2007 the number of interested schools increased to 21 and over 300 children showed keenness in joining the cricket academy. Hence coaching has started in 3 gymkhana's i.e. Wankar Gymkhana, Shivaj Park Gymkhana and Dahanu Gymkhana. 4 teams under 17 and 20 years under 13 were formed for training. The other coaches involved under Mr. Wankar are Mr. S.P. Bhatia, Mr. Suresh Chandra and Mr. Rajeev Kargalkar.

What some students have to say about SBCA:

Ashish Saini says, "The idea of free Salaam Bombay Foundation makes me think SBCA will be training only students from middle class families because we cannot afford to buy big bats for cricket training. But after what I have seen so far, not only have everything about cricket, but also how to behave, to perform as a team and become successful. For this, we need to keep away from tobacco and other bad habits. We should not smoke any kind."

Pratik Dhanraj says, "In SBCA, I've learnt to become more disciplined and organised, my marks at school have also improved. But, the game taught me to concentrate. I used to come when it came to my studies and probably to sleep to come. Now I hold the World Cup for bats."

Another cricketer **Ashish Saini**, has not only picked up the right way to spin a ball, but these days he is also teaching everything to the girls of the NCHS about how to be from a 15 year old to a 10 year old – just about everything before to APMH when he goes to visit Mumbai's girls' school. "I see a dream world not within you in tobacco form. Don't only be in picking up a cigarette!"

Pratik Dhanraj says a player from Shivaj Park, it was a dream come true as he had practised for on the cricket ground. "SBCA was great option for me to learn how to play about 10. In dream of playing major tournaments. But I also learnt that only education can help you achieve your dreams."

Jayesh Prabhakar Wankar, another cricket crazy kid, had the best part in that Salgaon Heights cricket was great hitting and bowling. "Playing with a wooden ball in Mumbai and in learning all the tricks of the trade under the SBCA Little Master Challenge Cup. It's about smiling. "With these days, the only things I pick up with my friends are over cigarettes and the same it is over!"

Pratik Dhanraj has never a dream of becoming like any cricketer. "Through cricket in SBCA, I have learnt to win – about cricket and about life. Playing with a wooden ball is more important than the dream to keep away from tobacco. SBCA has helped me sharpen my cricket skill. My eyes are only on the trophy that my team will get when we win the Little Masters Challenge Cup. My ultimate dream, play for India!"
